Thirty five Birmingham schools facing strike threat



Council bosses must act urgently to avoid springtime school strikes.

GMB Union has today announced the names of thirty-five Birmingham Schools that will begin a formal strike vote next week.

The ballot comes after the union accused Birmingham City Council on delay in resolving the equal pay crisis impacting city workers.

Nearly ninety per cent of Birmingham workers backed strike action in a council wide consultative ballot earlier this month, with further waves of formal strike ballots expected to be announced.
