

Last ditch talks to avoid Wilko 'crippling' strike



We dearly hope we come away from these talks with a deal fit to put to our members

GMB is staging last ditch talks with Wilko management today [October 8, 2019] in a bid to avoid 'crippling' strikes.

Around 1,800 GMB members at two Wilko distribution centres – in Magor, Wales and Worksop, Nottinghamshire – were due to walk out on October 11, 14, 21 and 22 over forced weekend working.

The industrial action was expected to cripple Wilko deliveries to stores across the UK.



Last minute talks at Wilko headquarters in Worksop – which conciliation service ACAS will attend – aim to prevent the strikes.
